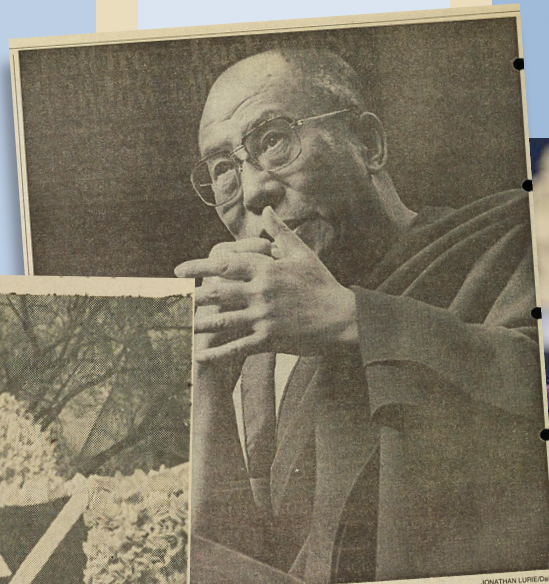
More than 17,000 people lined Ann Arbor streets for the annual **Michigras parade** on April 25.

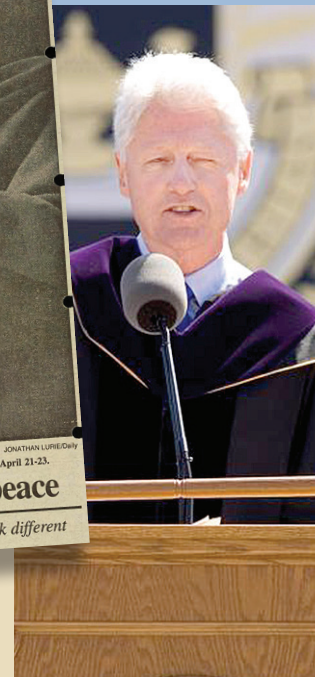

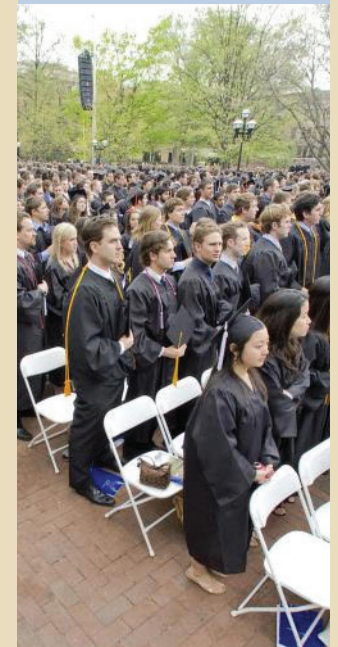
